Food Preservation Class Being Offered in Onaga

Garden produce is starting to ripen and before you know it you will be leaving zucchini on your neighbor's porch in the middle of the night. Being prepared to deal with fresh produce is important, and knowing and practicing the skills of canning and freezing can save you money and time, as well as give you healthy produce all year long. The Pottawatomie County Extension Office is hosting a Food Preservation Class in Onaga on July 12thto help you learn these techniques. Karen Blakeslee, an Extension Associate and the Director the Rapid Response Center, will be teaching this class. This class is great for the beginner, but it also helps those that have been canning for a while to learn some new tips and tricks.

The class will run from 9am-4pm and will be at the Onaga High School FACS Classroom. The class cost is \$30 a person, which includes all the canning supplies and lunch. You will take home several canned goods after the class, as well as dried herbs. This is a hands on workshop that highlights pressure canning, waterbath canning, dehydration and freezing. Youth (under 12) are invited to come as long as they are accompanied by an adult. The cost for youth is \$20 dollars. To register you need to contract the Extension office by June 30th. Here are the guidelines!


