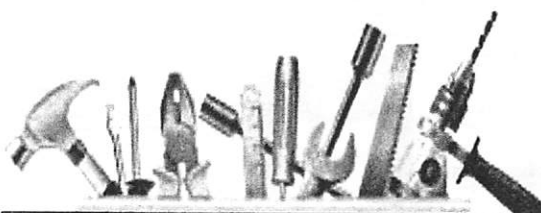

City of Olsburg
Regular Meeting Summary, July 3, 2024, 7:00 PM

Call to Order

Seeing there was a quorum present to conduct business, the regular meeting of the Olsburg City Council was called to order by Mayor Aric Cassel at 7:03 pm.

Present were Mayor Aric Cassel, Council Members Cindy Pfaff, Mike Mayer, Kyle Rootring, and Karl Kasselmann. Also, present were City Treasurer Gregg Gibson and City Clerk Jeannie Johnson. Absent was Council Member David Gibson.

Guests: No guests were present

Approve Minutes: Mayer moved to approve the June 5, 2024, Regular Meeting minutes. Rootring seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Public Comment: No public comment

Treasurer Report City Treasurer Gibson gave the June 2024 Treasurer's Reports and presented bills to be paid. Rootring moved to approve the June 2024 Treasurer's Report. Pfaff seconded. Motion carried 4-0.

Council member Reports:

- a. Street – Mike Mayer – He will not be able to spray the wastewater lagoons for weeds and suggested calling PrairieStone to see if they could perform that service.
- b. Water- Kyle Rootring – No Report
- c. Sewer – Karl Kasselmann – No Report
- d. Parks – David Gibson – No Report
- e. President- Cindy Pfaff – No Report

Old Business:

- a. Change in Insurance Agency – A quote should be ready for review by the middle of July.
- b. Line Locator – Mayer suggested Ditch Witch as they have some reasonably priced locators that are sufficient for the City's needs.
- c. Hydrant Meter – Last month the Council voted to purchase a hydrant meter from Salina Supply. When the final parts list was turned the cost was nearly double what was originally quoted. Cassel is checking with some other sources to find a better solution.

New Business:

- a. Discuss City of Olsburg 2025 Budget – The 2025 Budget Hearing will be held on August 7, 2024, 7:00 pm at City Hall.
- b. The Farmhouse Off Premises Cereal Malt Beverage License Renewal was approved.
- c. Kansas Rural Water Association (KRWA) Valve Exercising Program was approved.
- d. Water Tower Standpipe Exterior Painting – A decision will be made at the next meeting.
- e. Emergency Preparedness – A draft of the City Emergency Preparedness Plan was presented to the Council for review and suggestions.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm.

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The “Dog Days” of summer are from July 3 to August 11 each year. They’re usually the hottest and most unbearable days of the season. We often hear about the “Dog Days” of summer, but few know where the expression originated. Some think it’s a reference to the hot, sultry days that are “not fit for a dog.” Others suggest it’s the time of year when the extreme heat drives dogs mad. But where does the term come from? And what does it have to do with dogs? You may be surprised to see it has to do with the stars! Read on...



The phrase is a reference to Sirius, the **Dog Star**.

During the “Dog Days” period, the Sun occupies the same region of the sky as Sirius, the brightest star visible from any part of Earth. Sirius is a part of the constellation *Canis Major*, the *Greater Dog*.

In the summer, Sirius rises and sets with the Sun. On July 23rd, specifically, it is in conjunction with the Sun, and because the star is so bright, the ancient Romans believed it actually gave off heat and added to the Sun’s warmth, accounting for the long stretch of sultry weather. They referred to this time as *diēs caniculārēs*, or “dog days.”

Thus, the term Dog Days of Summer came to mean the 20 days before and 20 days after this alignment of Sirius with the Sun—July 3 to August 11 each year.

While this period usually *is* the hottest stretch of summer, the heat is not due to any added radiation from Sirius, regardless of its brightness. The heat of summer is simply a direct result of the Earth’s tilt.

During summer in the Northern Hemisphere, the tilt of the Earth causes the Sun’s rays to hit at a more direct angle, and for a longer period of time throughout the day. This means longer, hotter days.
