**46th Annual Spring Tasting Luncheon
"Bee Healthy"**

The 46th Annual Spring Tasting Luncheon will take place on **Thursday, March 19, 2026**. Anyone may participate by preparing a family-favorite dish for the luncheon. Each year, the event is sponsored by **Pottawatomie County K-State Extension** and the **Pottawatomie County Farm Bureau**.

The luncheon will be held at **First Presbyterian Church**, 601 Elm Street, Wamego. Registration begins at **11:00 a.m.**, with the meal served at **11:30 a.m.**

The public is encouraged to share a recipe and bring the prepared dish on the day of the luncheon, along with a **non-perishable food item** from their recipe to donate to the Food Pantry. All ages are invited to participate, and each attendee is asked to submit a recipe.

This year's speaker will feature **Courtney Simpson**, who will share about her family's beekeeping and honey production business.

Recipes for the **2026 Tasting Luncheon** must be received or postmarked by **March 6, 2026**. Recipes may be emailed to **jjeanna@ksu.edu** or mailed to the **Pottawatomie County Extension Office**, P.O. Box 127, Westmoreland, KS 66549.

Select the recipe for the dish you plan to bring to the **2026 Tasting Luncheon**, then follow these directions:

1. **Print or type your recipe**, or email it to **jjeanna@ksu.edu**. Please ensure it is legible and that all ingredients are accurate. The typist is not familiar with all recipes and must be able to read them clearly. **Be sure to include the number of servings.**
2. Include your **name, address, and phone number** in case there are questions about your recipe.
3. Specify the **category** for your recipe: main dish, vegetable, salad, bread, dessert, or miscellaneous. Please include the **serving size**.
4. Proofread your recipe carefully and double-check ingredients for errors.

To attend the Tasting Luncheon, you must do the following:

1. Submit your recipe by **March 6, 2026**, to the Pottawatomie County Extension Office.
2. Prepare your dish and bring it on **March 19**, along with your own table service. Please follow proper food safety and sanitation practices. All perishable foods should be kept below **40°F** or above **140°F**. Food should not remain in the danger zone for more than two hours, including serving time.
3. Bring a **non-perishable food item** for the food pantry.

At the luncheon, a **complimentary copy of the recipe book** will be given to those who have submitted a recipe and brought their dish. Additional cookbooks may be purchased for **\$5.00**.

Text Message Service: The Quickest, Easiest Way to Get Information

As we approach summer, please consider opting in to our city text message service. Opting in will allow you to receive alerts from the city regarding information you need for changes in trash service, following storms and other urgent notifications. The text message service is the fastest way for the City to get information out to our residents, which can be critical in the event of a major weather event and residents need to know how to respond.

Email Billing Available!

As a reminder, USPS mail service has become more and more unreliable in getting our billing postcards out to our customers. Over the past year and a half we've had many complaints of bills not being received or arriving damaged.

To make it easier for our customers to receive their bills in a timely manner, email billing is available with our new billing software. Customers can receive a bill via email, through regular mail or both.

Water and Sewer Rates to Change in April

Beginning April 1, 2026, rates for Water will increase from \$4.50/1000 gallons to \$5.00/1000 gallons and Sewer rates for Residential customers will increase from \$18.00/month to \$24.00/month; School from \$31.00/month to \$37.00/month; Restaurants from \$22.00/month to \$28.00/month; Business and Commercial from \$31.00/month to \$37.00/month.

Rate increases will be seen on utility bills sent in May 2026 for April's service. There is no change in rates for trash service.

Call to Order - There being a quorum present the regular meeting of the Olsburg City Council was called to order by Mayor Aric Cassel at 7:02 PM.

Present were Mayor Aric Cassel, Council Members Karl Kasselman, John White, Marcelino Abuerne, Kyle Rootring, City Water Operator Lyle Blockcolsky, City Maintenance Manager Greg Klenda, City Treasurer Gregg Gibson and City Clerk Jeannie Johnson. Absent was Council Member David Gibson.

Minutes: January 7, 2026 Minutes were approved.

Elect New President of the Council Kasselman was elected to the position of President of the Council.

Guests: No guests were present.

Public Comment: No public comments were presented.

Treasurer Report: January 2026 Treasurer Report and presented bills to be paid were presented and approved.

City Water Operator Report –Blockcolsky has ordered supplies needed for maintenance of the chlorinator. No other items to report.

City Maintenance Manager Report – Klenda has been organizing the city shop and connex box, took the city pickup to get new tires, the hydraulic pump on the mower has been leaking and was taken to have gaskets and o rings replaced, cleared snow, spread ice melt on the main streets and intersections, cut back and trimmed tree overgrowth along 3rd Street and Grove Streets.

Clerk Report – The Twin Valley Community Grant submitted in November was not chosen this year. Other grant opportunities are being researched to help provide financial assistance for projects. Pottawatomie County Commissioners are once again offering a \$750.00 grant to cities in the county for parks and park equipment. The Clerk will make an application for small improvements at Greenwood Park.

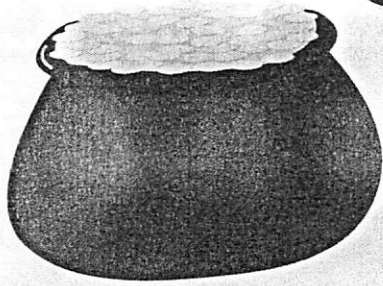
- a. Tree Removal on S 1st Street will be reviewed at the March 4th meeting.

New Business:

- a. Ordinance NO. 387 – Annexing Land into the City of Olsburg was approved.
- b. Resolution 2026-02 – Establishes a Fee Schedule for fee related ordinances was approved.
- c. Ordinance NO. 388 – Fixing Water Rates was approved.
- d. The rate for each 1000 gallons of water used will increase from \$4.50 per thousand to \$5.00 per thousand.
This change will take effect April 1, 2026 and be reflected on utility bills sent in May 2026 for April's usage.
- e. Ordinance NO. 389 – Fixing Sewer Rates was approved. Rates will increase as listed below:
 - Residential customers from \$18.00/month to \$24.00/month;
 - Schools from \$31.00/month to \$37.00/month;
 - Restaurants from \$22.00/month to \$28.00/month;
 - Business and Commercial from \$31.00/month to \$37.00.This change will take effect April 1, 2026 and be reflected on utility bills sent in May 2026 for April's usage.
- f. 2026 After Prom Donation Request – A \$150 donation was approved.
- g. City Clerks and Municipal Finance Officers Association Spring Conference will be held March 10-13, 2026 in Manhattan. The Clerk requested to attend. The request was approved.

A motion to pay bills was approved. A motion to adjourn the meeting was approved.
The Meeting was adjourned at 9:10 pm.

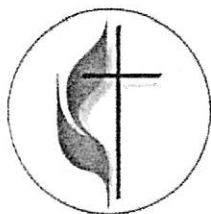
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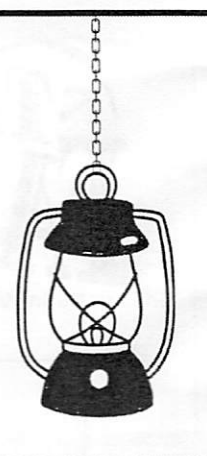
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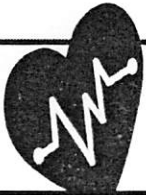
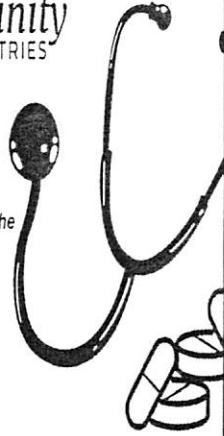


Safety Net Clinic
