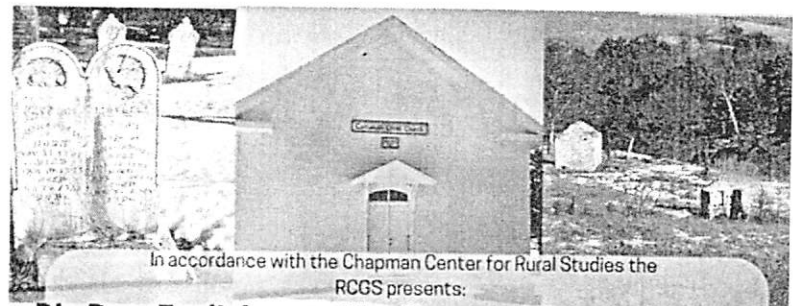

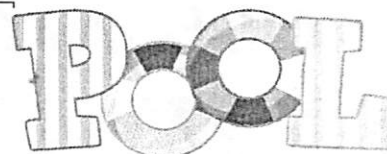

They held a clean-up day and got our pool house in tip-top shape.

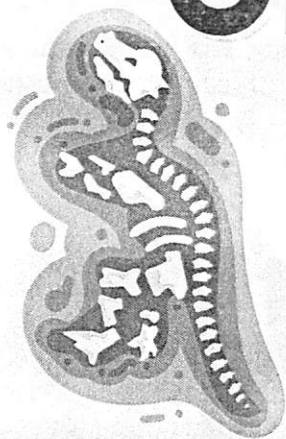
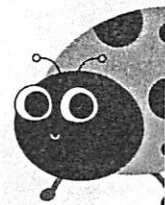

WHAT IS THE LITTLE FAIR

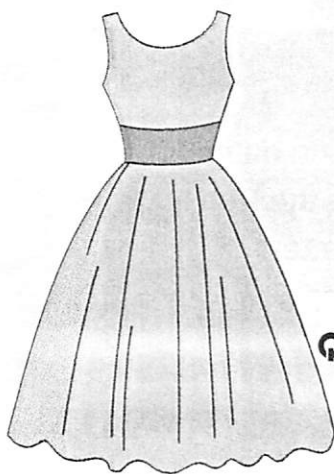

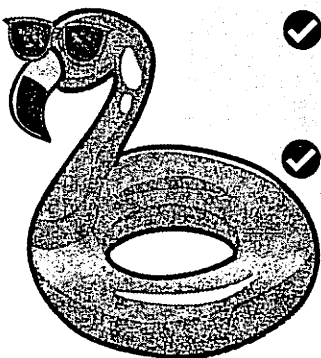

The text message service is the fastest way for the City to get information out to our residents, which can be critical in the event of a major weather event and residents need to know how to respond.

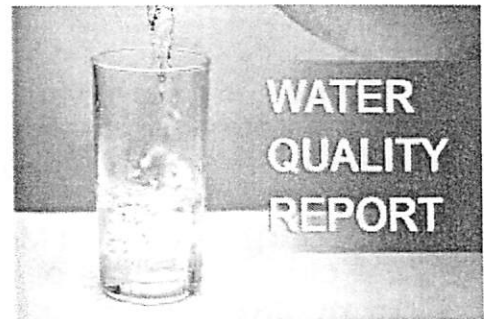


We are making it easier for *residents* of the City of Olsburg to opt in to receive text messages from the City.

2024 Consumer Confidence Report Available On City Website



Residents of the City of Olsburg may now access the annual Consumer Confidence Report on your drinking water. The CCR provides you with important information about the quality of your drinking water. The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires every community water supplier to provide a CCR to its customers.

Community water suppliers must provide CCRs to their customers either by mail or online. The report for Olsburg is on the CityOfOlsburg.com website. A link for the report is located on the right side of the homepage, "2024 Consumer Confidence Report Now Available". The link "2024 CCR" is highlighted in green and is in pdf format, printable and downloadable to your computer or device.

City of Olsburg Regular Meeting Summary
June 4, 2025, 7:00 PM

Call to Order

Seeing there was no quorum present to conduct business Mayor Cassel called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Present were Mayor Aric Cassel, Council Members Mike Mayer and Kyle Rootring. Also, present were City Treasurer Gregg Gibson and City Clerk Jeannie Johnson. Council Members Cindy Pfaff, David Gibson, and Karl Kasselmann were absent.

Council Member Gibson joined the meeting by phone at 8:15 pm

Guests: Harlan Ross

Minutes of the May 7, 2025 Regular Meeting were approved.

Public Comment: Harlan Ross asked if the city would approve blocking off 3rd Street between Fir and Elm Streets so he can have a tree on his property removed. Mayor Cassel said the city would provide blockades and asked that Ross contact the city when the tree would be removed.

Treasurer Report for May 2025 Treasurer Report was presented by Treasurer Gibson. Bills to be paid were presented. The treasurer report was approved.

Old Business:

- a. Harlan Ross presented the final plat for the Olsburg Second Addition, Unit Two (Greenwood Addition). The final plat was approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission at a public hearing on Wednesday, May 21, 2025. The City Council will schedule a Special Meeting to approve the plat when more council members can be present.
- b. Code Enforcement – The City of Wheaton has organized a meeting with ProCode Compliance to discuss code enforcement options for the smaller communities in Pottawatomie County. A representative from Olsburg will plan to attend.
- c. Safe Streets 4 All Grant – The grant was originally proposed by Blue Valley Consultants in early May, however, in late May the Flint Hills Regional Council stepped in to coordinate the grant application. The Clerk contacted the Pottawatomie County representative, Dee McKee, to the FHRC to express the city's interest in being part of the grant.

New Business:

- a. Change in the Olsburg Emergency Response Plan – Jennifer Merrow, Director, Pottawatomie County Emergency Management suggest changing the responsibility of establishing a curfew in the event of an emergency from the City Council (which would require a special meeting of the Council) to the Mayor. The change was approved.
- b. Treasurer Gibson gave an update on preparations for the 2026 Budget.
- c. Mayor Cassel presented a letter of resignation from Council Member Mike Mayer. The resignation was accepted.
- d. Open Council Position – Mayor Cassel recommended Marcelino Albuerne. The recommendation was approved.

Bills were approved to be paid.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:38 pm.



New Utility Billing Software

Over the past few months, we have been preparing for installation of new utility billing software at City Hall.

Earlier this month, the software was installed and training on a new system began. Jayhawk Software will be a vast improvement over the previous system. We look forward to sharing with our customers some of the features available as we learn more in training.

While bill cards will still, one feature we believe will be an advantage to customers is email billing. Email billing will allow us to reduce the cost of sending bills through regular mail and ensure your bill arrives in a timely manner.

It will take a few weeks for us to become familiar with the new system, so please be patient as we go through the learning process. We hope to have everything running smoothly by the end of August!

November 4, 2025 Election

Anyone interested in running for Mayor or City Council contact City Hall, 785-468-3209, or the Pottawatomie County Election Office 785-457-3314.



Write-in candidate's names will not appear on the ballot and as the name implies those people will need to conduct a campaign to have constituents write their name on the ballot when voting.

The position of Mayor and two Council seats are up for election.

Current Mayor, Aric Cassel has filed for election with the Pottawatomie County Elections Office. His name will appear on the November ballot.

Qualifications to be a Candidate are:

- ✓ Must be 21 years of age
- ✓ Must be a registered voter
- ✓ Must be a resident within the city limits of Olsburg

Between now and November 4th, those interested in running for office are encouraged to attend as many Council meetings as possible. This will be a benefit by becoming familiar with the issues brought before the Council and allow the candidate to learn how the process of local government works.

Of course, all meetings of the City Council are public meetings and are open for the public to attend.

If you are interested in obtaining more information regarding what is involved with being on the City Council or would like more information regarding conducting a write-in campaign, please stop by City Hall!
