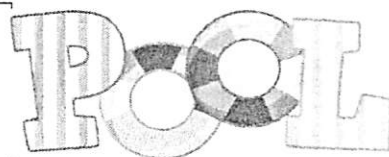

Annual Summer Reading & Summer Food Program at the Library

The Pottawatomie Wabaunsee Regional Library is gearing up for our annual Summer Reading Program. As families begin their annual journey toward the time when there is “nothing to do”, we ask parents to remember that the Summer Reading Program at the library may be the answer! Children may begin checking out and reading books for the 2025 reading challenge on June 1st. Participants will have until the program’s completion on July 31st to reach their reading goals.

The 2025 “**Color Our World**” summer reading theme invites participants to embark on a journey of art and creativity during the annual summer reading experience at the library. Children may participate at any PWRL location, including libraries in Alma, Alta Vista, Eskridge, Harveyville, Olsburg, Onaga, St. Marys, and Westmoreland. Pre-readers are invited to join the program with a parent or helper who will read to them as members of the Read-to-Me Club. Adults are also welcomed and encouraged to participate. The goal is to keep Everyone Reading over the summer!

Participants in the Library Summer Reading Challenge will be asked to check out library books at their reading level and log them to receive credit in the program. Completion of craft activities, and attendance at special library programs will also count toward Summer Reading Program credits. All participants can earn prizes for their efforts. Registration is open now at all PWRL Library Locations.

There are many studies that look at the value of reading. Readers gain valuable knowledge about the world and their place in it. Reading exercises the brain. It improves the readers focus, and enhances memory. Reading improves the reader’s ability to empathize with others. Reading improves the communication skills of the reader. It reduces stress, improves mental health, and contributes to the longevity of the reader.

Studies also show that children who continue to read during summer vacation perform better in the fall when school resumes. The library’s summer reading program provides a chance for children to maintain their reading momentum and have fun at the same time. Special events will be scheduled each week throughout the summer to help promote the summer reading program and give children an opportunity to join the fun. Some locations will also have special reading activities for teens and adults. All programs are free and open to the public.

The Pottawatomie Wabaunsee Regional Library will also be hosting a Summer Food Program that will be conducted as part of the 2025 Summer Reading Program. PWRL, with the help of the Catholic Charities of Northeast Kansas and in partnership with the Kansas Department of Education, will be providing free shelf-stable lunches to children during the summer through the USDA Federal food and nutrition program. Parents or caregivers will again be allowed to receive up to five days of shelf stable lunches with milk for every child 18 and younger in a single weekly pickup.

Meals will be served along with other activities surrounding PWRL’s annual Summer Reading Program. PWRL’s Alma, Eskridge, Onaga, Harveyville, Olsburg, and Westmoreland are eligible to provide this service. PWRL’s Alta Vista location will provide the service in July while the local school district will provide meals in June. The PWRL St. Marys headquarters location has been notified that they will not be eligible to distribute meals to children through the Summer Food Program. Food for children in this community will also be provided by the local school district.

There are no income requirements or registration necessary to receive meals. Any child 18 or younger may pick up lunches, and are also welcome and encouraged to participate in the all other Summer Reading Program activities planned at each of PWRL’s eight locations in Pottawatomie and Wabaunsee Counties.

Library staff members have worked with each school district to get flyers and instructions for the Summer Reading / Summer Food Program sent to each child. Flyers and instruction sheets will also be posted to the PottWab Regional Library website at <http://www.pottwab.org> and on the Pottawatomie Wabaunsee Regional Library Facebook page.

- A special end of Summer Reading Wrap Party with snow cone treats will be held **Thursday, July 24th from 11 a.m. – 3 p.m.**

Please plan to visit your library soon. Read books, attend special programs, pickup crafts packets and color sheets, and get lunch to go. Participants will earn prizes as they read along with us this summer! All programs are free and open to the public. If you have more trash bags than will fit in your trash cart, a trash bag tag is required for extra bags to be picked up. Extra trash bags tags are \$5.00 per bag, available at City Hall.

The City is charged for estimated total weight each week. Any overages from large items and extra trash bags means extra expense to the City which may require an increase in service charges to all residents. Please be considerate of everyone by disposing of extra items responsibly.

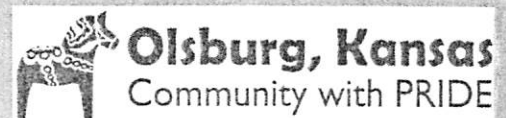

Local Elections Will Be Held November 4, 2025

Anyone interested in running for Mayor or City Council contact City Hall, 785-468-3209, or the Pottawatomie County Election Office 785-457-3314. The **filing deadline is June 2nd at NOON**. If you are interested, you **must file IN PERSON** at the County Clerk's office at 207 N 1st Westmoreland, KS.



If a candidate does not choose to file for election, their name will not appear on the ballot in November and they will need to run a write-in campaign.

The position of Mayor and two Council seats are up for election.

Qualifications to be a Candidate (whether filed or not) are:

- ✓ Must be 21 years of age
- ✓ Must be a registered voter
- ✓ Must be a resident within the city limits of Olsburg
