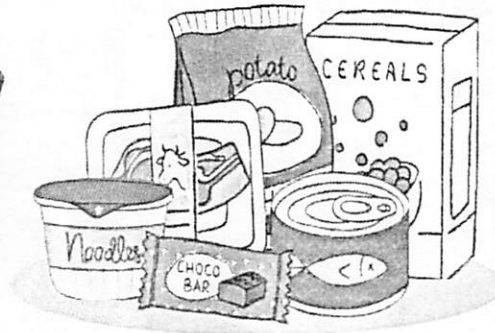

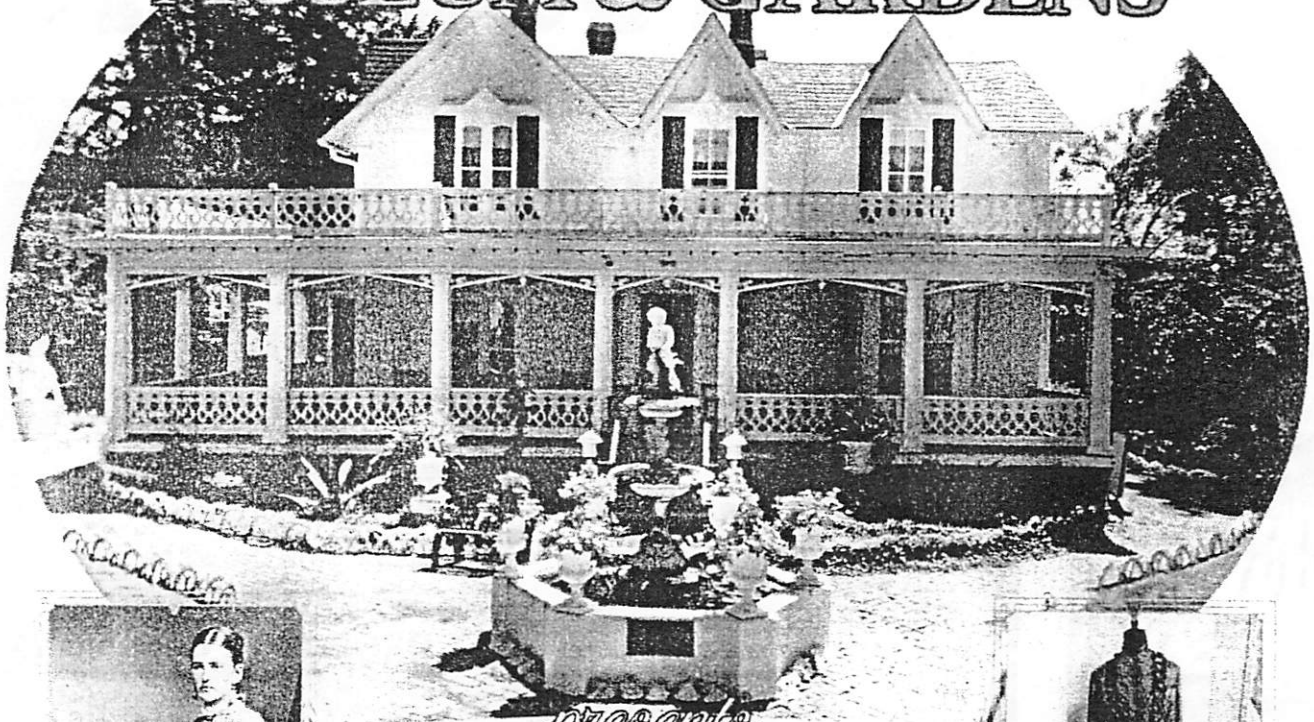

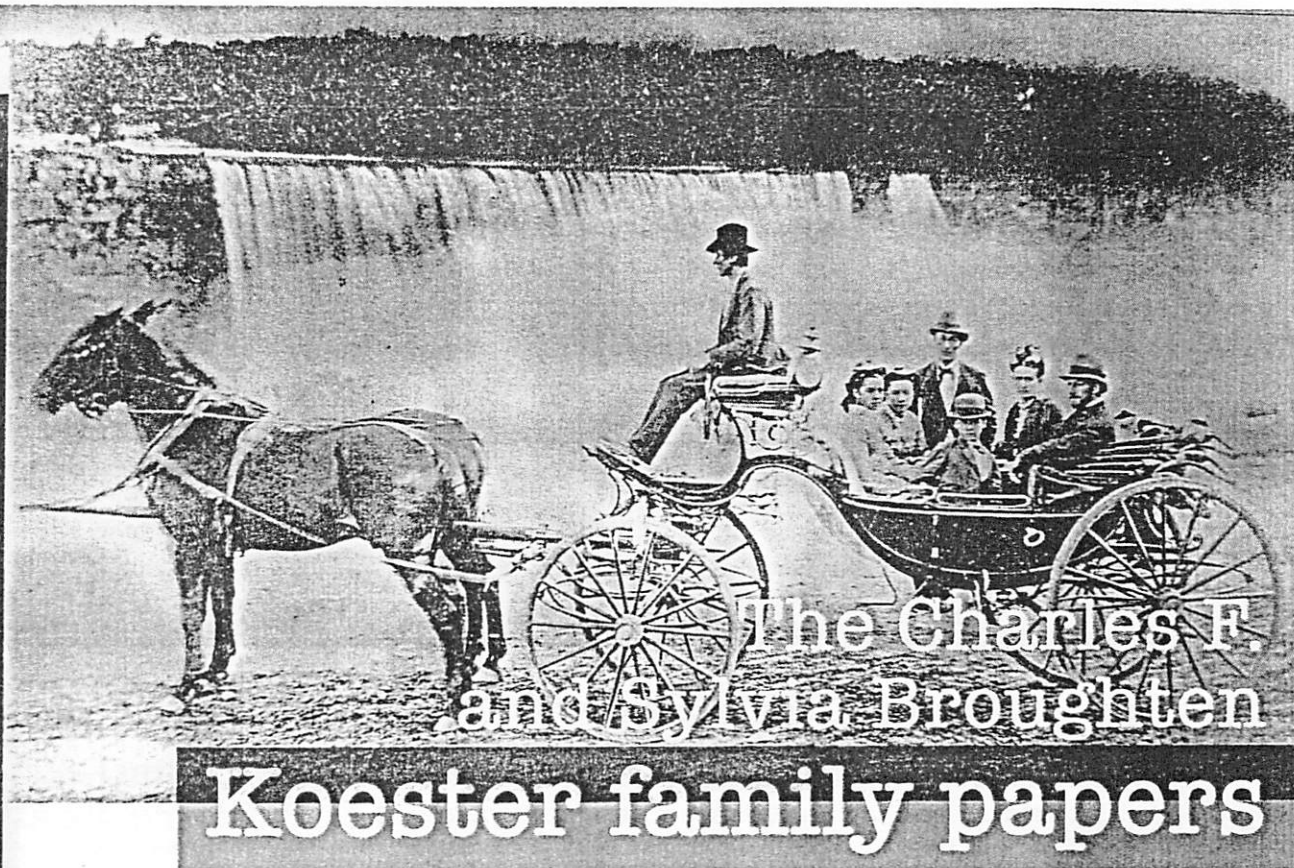

In September 1876, Kansan Charles F. Koester, along with his wife, Sylvia, two nieces and two nephews, endured an uncomfortable train ride from Jersey City, New Jersey, to spend a day at Niagara Falls. Arriving at 2 a.m., “tired and almost sick,” they slept at the International Hotel overlooking the river above the falls.

By noon, they were observing the falls by carriage, and Charles called one view of them “very romantic and is not easily described; it must be seen.” After further explorations, he summarized the experience this way: “These grandeurs must be seen to know of their vastness.”

Charles had already visited the east coast earlier that year. The United States was celebrating its centennial, and Charles was a member of a Kansas group that helped plan the festivities. He arrived in Philadelphia in May for the opening of the Centennial Exposition before returning to Marysville, Kansas.

In July, Charles and Sylvia were married. They traveled east for a honeymoon trip spanning August and September, stopping to see relatives, friends and other sites on the way there and back. Stops included Cincinnati; Washington, D.C.; Philadelphia; Jersey City; and Niagara Falls.

We know of this trip through Charles' diary, a practice he kept consistently for more than 25 years. His descendants preserved those volumes, along with photographs

and many other historical records, and recently donated them to the Richard L. D. and Marjorie J. Morse Department of Archives and Special Collections.

These documents reveal Charles' life before arriving in Marysville, the life he and Sylvia built with their three children, his heartache when Sylvia died of tuberculosis in 1883, and how he and the children mourned and found ways to carry on. These types of records are a boon to those seeking to understand the lives of previous generations of Kansans, including what they experienced and how they responded to the events of life.

The Morse Department of Archives and Special Collections is thankful to the descendants of Charles and Sylvia for donating these important archives that help document rural Kansas in

the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Sarah Koester Morrison and Julia King Muller have represented the family, and Sarah has been the most recent caretaker of the bulk of the records. Julia and her husband, Earl Shreckengast, provided a financial contribution to support processing, conservation and selective digitization of the materials.

The Shreckengasts have also provided funds for two history students to work with the Koester House Museum in

Marysville to prepare exhibits for the 2026 sesquicentennial celebration of Charles and Sylvia's wedding. The students and museum personnel are collaborating with K-State Libraries and the Chapman Center for Rural Studies for the museum displays, as well as for one that will open on the fifth floor of Hale Library in spring 2026.

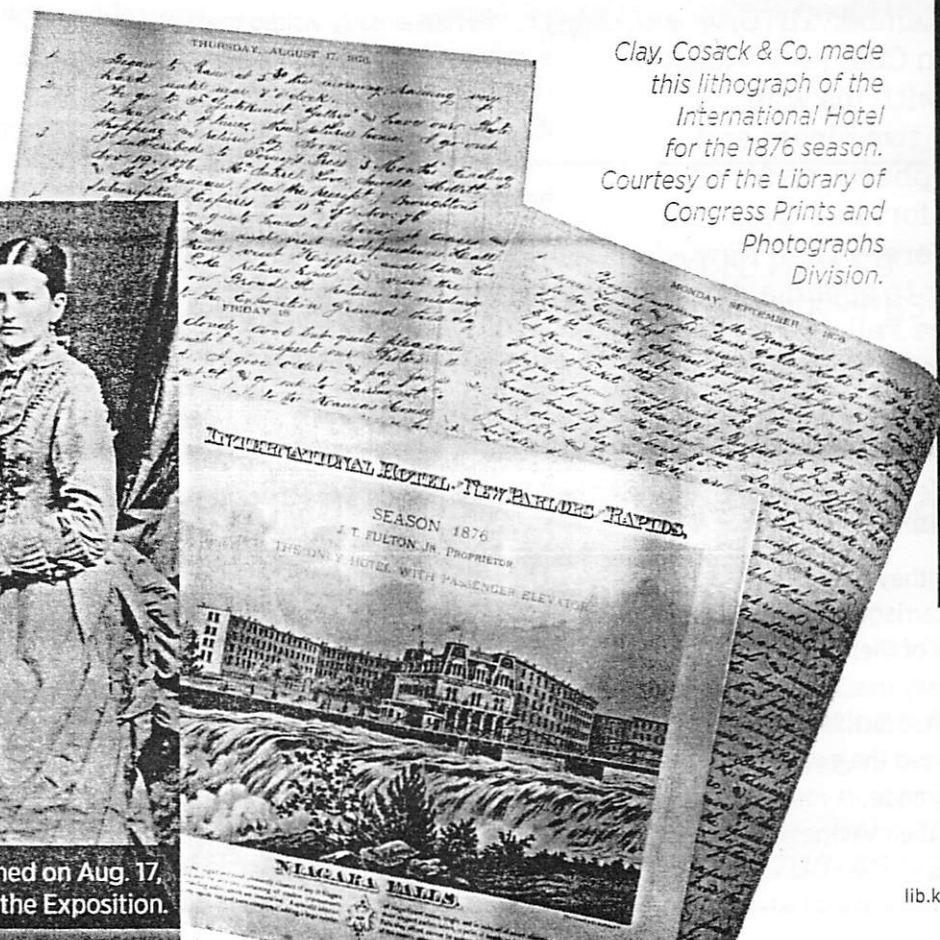

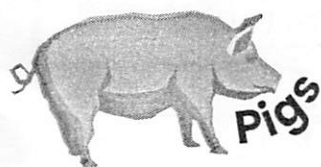
WHAT IS THE LITTLE FAIR

The Little Fair is at the Olsburg American Legion July 19th, from 4:00p.m.-6:00 p.m.

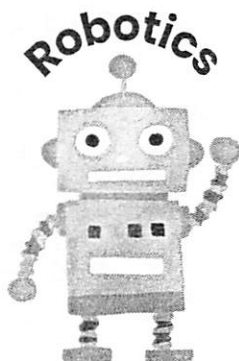

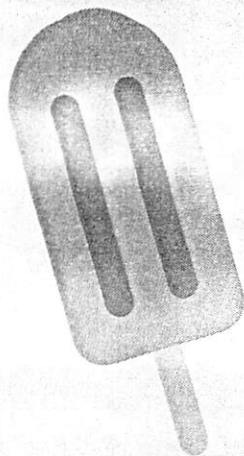

Opting in will allow you to receive alerts from the city regarding information you need for changes in trash service, following storms and other urgent notifications. The text message service is the fastest way for the City to get information out to our residents, which can be critical in the event of a major weather event and residents need to know how to respond.

Regular Meeting Summary, June 3, 2026 7:00 PM

Call to Order - There being a quorum present the regular meeting of the Olsburg City Council was called to order by Mayor Aric Cassel at 7:04 PM.

Present were Mayor Aric Cassel, Council Members Kyle Rootring, Karl Kasselmann, and John White, City Treasurer Gregg Gibson and City Clerk Jeannie Johnson, City Water Operator Lyle Blockcolsky. Absent were Council Members David Gibson, Marcelino Albuerne and City Maintenance Supervisor Greg Klenda.

Minutes were approved.

Guests/Public Comment: Harlan Ross, City Planning and Zoning Commissioner

Treasurer Report was approved.

City Water Operator Report – Will be replacing the toilet at Greenwood Park. Putting a hold on ordering a new chlorinator pump.

City Maintenance Manager Report -

Clerk Report – Presented in written form.

Council Member Reports:

- a. President- Karl Kasselmann – No Report
- b. Street – John White – Gravel is needed in City Park alley and
- c. Water- Marcelino Albuerne – Absent
- d. Sewer – Kyle Rootring – No Report
- e. Parks - David Gibson – Absent

Old Business:

- a. Varney's and Associates Audit Reports for 2024 and 2025 – have been received. No problems or concerns.
- b. City Park Video Cameras – Wiring for the cameras at the basketball court has been re-run. Timer and cameras are now working.

New Business:

- a. The City has been asked to allow a travel trailer to be in the mobile home park due to a hardship for a resident. Ross suggested a Conditional Use Permit in the form of a Memorandum of Understanding between the City and the Resident. The MOU will state the length of time not to exceed one year and other conditions. The Clerk will compose a MOU.

Bills were approved for payment.

Maintenance of City Rights of Way Explained

Municipal rights-of-way (ROW) are dedicated corridors owned or controlled by cities or counties for public infrastructure like roads, sidewalks, and utilities. While the municipality manages the overall corridor, local property owners are generally responsible for adjacent yard upkeep, and private contractors must obtain specific permits to perform construction or repairs.

Understanding responsibilities and requirements for maintaining these areas ensures compliance and prevents property hazards.

Ownership and Maintenance Responsibilities

- **Public Use:** The ROW is public property used for transit, sidewalks, utilities, and traffic control devices.
- **Yard Upkeep:** Even though it is city-owned, the maintenance of adjacent landscaped areas (mowing, weed control, and general clearing of personal driveways) typically falls on the abutting property owner.
- **City and Utility Work:** Municipalities and utility providers handle the maintenance, repair, and clearing of the heavy infrastructure (pavement, streetlights, and buried utility lines).

Vegetation and Safety Maintenance

- **Sight Triangles:** Municipalities prioritize vegetation control at intersections to ensure drivers have a clear line of sight and warning signs remain visible.
- **Drainage:** Keeping drainage ditches and culverts clear of debris is essential for preventing flooding and road erosion.
- **Obstruction Removal:** Permanent structures such as fences, sheds, and swing sets are generally prohibited in the ROW. If they are placed there, municipalities can require removal at the owner's expense.
