Summary of Regular Meeting
April 3, 2024, 7:00 PM

Call to Order

Seeing there was a quorum present to conduct business, the regular meeting of the Olsburg City Council was called to order by Mayor Aric Cassel at 7:02 pm.

Present were Mayor Aric Cassel, Council Members Mike Mayer, Cindy Pfaff, Kyle Rootring and Karl Kasselmann. Also, present were City Treasurer Gregg Gibson and City Clerk Jeannie Johnson. Absent was Council Member David Gibson.

Guests: Terry Force, Jonathan Anschutz, PE, Schwab Eaton

Approve Minutes: March 20, 2024, Special Meeting minutes were approved.

Public Comment: Terry Force was present to visit with the Council regarding his efforts to become County Commissioner for Pottawatomie County 5th District.

Treasurer Report City Treasurer Gibson gave the Treasurer's Report and presented bills to be paid. Treasurer's report was approved.

Council member Reports:

Street Commissioner Mayer reported now that the weather is warming up it will be easier to get potholes repairs made.

Old Business:

- a. Lagoon Project Update – Jonathan Anschutz explained changes being made to the original plan for the wetland cell on the west side of the present ponds. Altered KDHE specifications have led to slightly changing the placement of the cell to meet KDHE approval.
- b. Brush barrier at City Dump has been completed.
- c. Municipal Water Conservation Plan – The MWCP has been reviewed by the State and approved.
- d. Ordinance NO. 385 – Water Drought/Emergency Ordinance was approved.
- e. Office Upgrade – Work has begun.

New Business:

- a. Community Cleanup – A roll off dumpster will be delivered May 23, 2024. A list of acceptable items will be posted in the newsletter and on Facebook.

Bills were approved for payment.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:09 pm.
